**CIRCULAR NO.3/2010**


In continuation to Circular No.1/2010 dated 15<sup>th</sup> February, 2010 in the context of implementation of recommendations of the Internal Technical Committee(ITC), the following may please be noted in the context of committed liabilities in the nine Regional Offices of CAPART:

- 1) The 51<sup>st</sup> Executive Committee in its meeting held on 25.01.2010 has permitted the nine Regional Offices of CAPART to release Rs.13,81,81,004/- involving 963 projects which have been recommended for continuation. This will also include a total of 425 projects involving Rs.2,34,31,866/- for which only 10% reimbursement is due. A list of Regional Office-wise projects is given at Table-I and II of the Annexure.
- 2) Within the category "To be continued"(TBC), there are also projects which need to be closed after completion of 10% reimbursement as due. The Executive Committee recommended that all these projects should be closed within March, 2010 after observing necessary formalities.
- 3) Although the Committee has not examined cases belonging to FAS, etc. categories, provisions will have to be kept for these projects in case these are delisted. RR&MCs will thereafter have to take a decision as to the commensurate duration of the projects after release of funds for the projects.
- 4) For all projects which are recommended to be continued, it is stated that the VOs be given a commensurate period of time by RR&MCs to complete their project activities which may have been kept in abeyance on account of the embargo on fund release after 24<sup>th</sup> August, 2009 (Ref: decision of the 49<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee).
- 5) In case of projects suffering from a delay, wherever the delay has occurred due to procedural reasons (be it for delay in Monitor's report or inter divisional references or non-reporting in correct

format etc.) a curative time period may be accorded by RR&MCs to enable the VO to complete the project after the next release.

- 6) The 51<sup>st</sup> Executive Committee has also permitted CAPART to terminate 1068 projects amounting to Rs.16,42,93,714/- only in its nine Regional Offices.

This issues with the approval of Director General, CAPART.
